SPECIAL SECTION: Mental Health

This section may present summaries of theoretical or empirical articles, publications, or conferences related to the topic of Mental Health and its applications in different contexts. The limit must be 1000 words and references must be in APA style (7th edition)

- I. Brief News Section. Disclose your latest scientific article(s), book(s), master's or doctoral dissertations, and book reviews.
- II. World Section. Disseminate the proposals of your working group (WG); It is the section for Working Groups (WGs), National Representatives (RNs) and Voices of Membership.
- III. Shared Pride Section: Distinctions of the relevance of IAPA members.

Attention:

- It is necessary to have valid membership to publish in the newsletter.
- All articles must be submitted in two of the official languages of the SIP: Spanish, English, Portuguese, French and Portuguese.

I. SECTION "BRIEF NEWS"

The Bulletin aims to disseminate some work of an SIP member and contribute to the much-needed work of scientific dissemination.

It consists of small notes in the form of news (not a copy of the scientific summary) about the findings, advances, conclusions, etc., derived from your work published in the last 12 months. Add an eye-catching title of up to 10 words so that your note attracts the reader.

1. Approximate length of 150 words in any official language of the IAPA
2. It incorporates, at the end of the note, the reference in strict APA format of the published work on which the note is based.

Do not include footnotes.

II. SIP WORLD SECTION

A) *Working Groups*

Disseminate relevant knowledge concerning the topics and approaches carried out by your working group (official IAPA Working Groups). You can communicate and/or disseminate WG activities, actions, proposals, research, current topics, etc. Do not include footnotes.

Short title, no more than 10 words.

B) *National Representatives*

Highlight what you consider relevant regarding Psychology in your country or some actions that you have carried out as a national representative. The possibilities can be as diverse as Psychology and those who make it. Short title, no more than 10 words. Do not include footnotes.

In either case (working groups or national representatives) it is a brief, readable note, approximately 200 to 400 words. It can be smaller or even higher if desired. Do not include footnotes. Short title, no more than 10 words.

C) *Voices of Membership*

They can be reports of professional or intervention experiences, empirical works, or essays. The length of your contribution can vary between 600 and 3000 words. Strict adherence to the APA style, latest edition, indispensable. Do not include footnotes. Short title, no more than 10 words.



Language: Any official language of the SIP. Translation, if possible, into an additional language (English, Spanish, French, Portuguese) is appreciated to help with the promotion of what you disseminate.

D) Editorial News

Reviews of books authored by the membership or by the membership to other authors with relevant contributions to the psychology of the Americas. The length of your contribution can vary between 500 and 1000 words. Strict adherence to the APA style, latest edition, indispensable. Do not include footnotes: short title, no more than 12 words.

III. SHARED PRIDE SECTION

Have you recently received a distinction or recognition of relevance, or do you know a member of the IAPA who has received it? This is a section of the newsletter dedicated to sharing the most recent distinctions received in the professional practice of Psychology as well as meritorious achievements of IAPA member colleagues. Send the name of the recipient of the award (it can be you), the title of the award and a photo, preferably from the time of the award.
